Greetings all,

I hope everyone is doing well. Every group that I have had an opportunity to visit since we last met is carrying a strong message of recovery. People were friendly and welcoming. Thanks to all for keeping the doors open and the coffee hot. I had the privilege to attend the SOS business meeting. They do such an awesome job of working together to order supplies, pay rent and decide how to spend money. It was fun to watch. SOS group has requested that we have another activity soon and suggested a tubing trip. I spoke to Sherene from the Dam Group. All is well. She described a newcomer being picked up and brought to the meeting due to helpline referral. She said the person cried happy or maybe relieved tears when picked up for the meeting. Thank youphone-line. I spoke with two groups that are at this time sort of loners. They would like to be listed on our meeting schedules. The addresses and times are listed below. Simplicity group recently held a telephone speaker meeting with George from Oregon. He has been clean since NA began and has over 50 years NA recovery. It was a delight to hear him speak of how our new literature...Living Clean has made a difference in his life. I felt honored to be present. Thank you Simplicity for hosting. The step study group in NB is growing and moving right along. Books and study guides are provided. All are encouraged to share. The meeting is welcoming and full of recovery. The NB Freedom group is alive and well. That group likes to celebrate. The group celebrated 6 years of meeting . This past month one member celebrated 2 years while another celebrated 25 years. It is tradition for birthday people to wear a funny hat, receive cards (with hand decorated envelopes) and treats like cake or pie. The group is warm and welcoming. I visited Phoenix group in late May. The group was well attended and the sharing was great. Everyone was pleasant and welcoming. I attended the Regional Service Committee meeting.

During the RSC, our RD, George (regional delegate) and RDA, Heidi (alternate) described their experience at the recent World Service Conference. Heidi had a power point that really showed just how big we are. Both delegates described the strong....very strong need to move to a zonal forum form of meeting. Many regions are not able to be seated at the world convention because we have run out of room. The conference costs many thousand dollars (I think the figure was over 100,000) to put the conference on. Zonal representation will divide the world into zones and then decision making and discussion about traditional CARR topics (new literature, translations, etc.) will occur in zones. Then zonal representatives will get together and continue the discussions at a world level. Our fellowship is truly world wide!! I learned that NA has status of a Non Government Agency with the United Nations. (this was new to me..but

not as a situation) The need for this status is so NA members can meet in countries that the right to assemble is not a given. We have a service office to print and distribute literature because some of our members are not permitted to receive from the United States. I was overwhelmed with emotion and had a major..aaha moment when I realized the significance and power of NA as a healing, loving fellowship. Our primary purpose to carry the message is absolutely happening at a world level. We also discussed some about the upcoming convention TBRCNA in February. Other topics included area reports, letter writers needed for inmates in state justice system, H & I specifically (thank you Esteban) was thorough. The region is solvent. We also talked about ways to save money on travel.



Our smallest box (Size 1) fits 10–15 letter-sized envelopes or up to two rolled magazines. Start with a Size 2 box if you receive more than 15 mailpieces a week. Size 3, 4, or 5 is recommended if you receive magazines and catalogs.

If you need more room than our largest box provides, ask at your local Post Office about Business Mail Pickup (Caller) Service.

THERE ARE TWO SIMPLE WAYS TO APPLY

Apply online: Complete the online application at www.usps.com/poboxes and make your first payment with a credit or debit card. (Online registration is not available for Business Mail Pickup (Caller) Service or Qualifying No-Fee box customers.) **Apply at a Post Office:** Complete pages 3 and 4 and take this whole form to a Post Office most convenient for you. Once we verify your information and receive your payment, we will provide your PO Box address and begin your service.

ID REQUIRED

Whether you apply online or at a Post Office, **two valid forms of identification** are required when you obtain your keys or combination at the Post Office where your box is located. You must present the IDs at a Post Office. One item must contain a photograph and one must be traceable to the bearer (prove your physical address). Both must be current. Acceptable forms of ID include:

Photo ID Options:

- Valid driver's license or state non-driver's identification card
- Armed forces, government, university, or recognized corporate identification card
- Passport, passport card, alien registration card, or certificate of naturalization

Non-Photo ID Options:

- Current lease, mortgage, or deed of trust
- Voter or vehicle registration card
- Home or vehicle insurance policy

Note: Social Security cards, credit cards, and birth certificates are not acceptable forms of ID.

RENEWAL PAYMENTS

Renewal payments are due the last day of the month your service period ends. If your payment is late, you will not be able to access the mail in your box. After 10 days of nonpayment, we remove the mail, treat it as undeliverable, and close your box. You may also incur a late payment fee. Note that closed PO Boxes are available for new customers immediately, so late payment can lead to loss of your PO Box address. You may renew your PO Box online, at a Post Office, by mail, or at an Automated Postal Center® (APC®). It is your responsibility to pay your renewal fee on time. Convenient payment options are:

Pay online: Use a valid credit or debit card to make a one-time payment or set up automatic renewal payments at www.usps.com/poboxes.

Pay in person: Pay at the Post Office where your PO Box is located using cash, check, credit card, or debit card, or set up automatic renewal payments (available at most Post Offices). Automatic renewal payment is required for 3-month payment option.

Pay at any Automated Postal Center (APC): Find an APC at www.usps.com/locator or by downloading the mobile application at www.usps.com/mobile.
